Advent and Christmas season is already here. Advent is the fourweek season when all Christians, regardless of their denomination, expect, prepare, and celebrate the birth of Jesus, at the same time, are looking forward to the second coming of Jesus at the final day. It is joyful and exciting season that brings hope, faith, joy, peace, and light to the world as the Advent wreath candles represent. Many people in the world celebrate this season beyond their culture, even religion. It is not very hard to find many unbelievers in the world enjoying this season by sharing their gifts and having a party. Also, I still vividly remember that some Buddhist monks joined the Christmas worship service to celebrate the birth of Jesus. I believe many church members

already have some joyful plans such as decorating Christmas tree and house, purchasing some gifts for loved ones, and having a family gathering. I already had some fun decorating the church building with some other church members a few weeks ago. Buying some Christmas gifts for my children, decorating the house with the Christmas ornaments, and having some Christmas gatherings are already on my to-do-list. However, I hope our church members not only have fun this season but also deepen their relationship with Jesus. Thus, I am preparing and suggesting some spiritual ways to celebrate this Christmas that will bring you much more joy to your life.

1) Advent and Christmas Eve Worship Services


One of the most important and meaningful ways to celebrate the Christmas season is to participate in the advent and Christmas worship services. Worship is the central ways to deepen a relationship with God. Certainly, we will sing some traditional Christmas carols and light the Advent candles in the services to celebrate this season. Also, we will try to examine the familiar Christmas stories once again through the sermon. However, this time, we will see them from the perspective of Mary, the mother of Jesus. This will reveal hidden meanings of Christmas and another



aspect of God we did not know. In addition, some special music from some church and community members will enrich our worship experience.

There will be a few special worship services. On 12/11, we will have the Christmas program that our children and youth members have prepared. They will share the joy of Christmas with cute dances and songs. Also, they will present the nativity story with a few carols, instead of my long sermon. This will be a great opportunity for the church members to think about the meaning of the birth of Jesus with a lot of fun. On 12/24 at 6:30 PM, we will have Christmas Eve Candlelight worship service. The theme of the worship service is the Christmas story from the perspective of Mary, the mother of Jesus. We will think about the meaning of Christmas, following Mary's life journey. Three preachers (Mary, Denise, and me) will share short reflections on each stage of Mary's life in relation to Jesus throughout the service. Some brass music, Chancel Choir and special music will enrich your worship experience. Certainly, we will conclude the service by lighting the candles and singing, "Silent Night, Holy Night." Please plan to come and join with your family members. Also, please remember that we will have a regular worship service on Christmas Day at 9:00 AM.

2) Other Meaningful Ways to Celebrate the Christmas Season



Other than worship service, there are various ways to celebrate the Christmas season meaningfully and spiritually. The first thing coming to mind is to have a personal devotional time. There are a lot of devotional books out there, and I strongly recommend these resources to use in your personal devotional time. However, my strongest recommendation is the Bible itself, especially one of Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, & John). How about reading the book of Mark during this Christmas season and reflecting on Jesus' life and ministry once again?

Reading a good book about Christmas is one of the great ways to celebrate it. I strongly recommend "Not A Silent Night" (written by Adam Hamilton) this year. The author of the book brings great and innovative insights on

Christmas stories from the perspective of Mary. In addition, it is easy to read. Furthermore, this book is my basic material for Advent sermon series, "Mary Looks Back to Bethlehem." If you read it with my sermon, it will enrich your spiritual life. If you are not a reader, joining Wednesday Bible Study group is a good option. Currently, they reflect on the Christmas stories from the perspective of Mary based on this book.

Lastly, sharing your love with other neighbors through one of the church missions would be the best way to celebrate the Christmas. I believe many of you plan to buy some gifts or already bought them for your loving family members and friends. I think it is the great way to express your love for them. However, if you extend your love for the marginalized in the society, it makes Christmas even better. So, I suggest the following: how about matching the price for your neighbors in need? For example, if you spend 100 dollars for gifts of your loving family members or friends, spend another 100 dollars for support the people in need. I believe it would be the wonderful way to celebrate the birth of Jesus and live out the message of the baby Jesus in the manger. There are a lot of missions that the Covenant community is doing for the people in need, such as Food for Families, Gifts for Families, collecting socks, mittens, and hats, and so on. Please join one of the missions to express Jesus' love for them.

Introduction of This Year's Confirmands


