

#### **United Methodist Men**

This past school year, U.M.M. truly reached out to our community. UMM bought school supplies-\$140, clothing-\$474, and water proof gloves-\$480 for the four schools and two field trips at Chegwin -\$657. It is because of the generosity of Covenant that this has been possible, from our sales of candy bars, jams and jellies. U.M.M. will meet again on July 8 at 8:00a.m. at Rolling Meadows. We are always looking for more men, just think what 20 of us could do!

#### C.C.A.P.

This is a recap of some of the things C.C.A.P. has done this year. We had forty weeks of school and eight boxes of bananas which equals to 320 boxes at \$112 a week. This equals to 4, 480 for 1,074 kids each week. In the summer, that is 4 boxes at \$52 a week or \$624 at the Brown Bag Program at Salvation Army. There was cereal for the school kids at 420 boxes, 32 cases each of Mac and Cheese cups, Chefboyrde, ramen noodles Rice Krispy Treats, fruit cups, 10 bottles of laundry soap, boots, hats, gloves. Again this was possible because of C.C.A.P. See the letter we received from Riverside School.

#### **Annual Conference Reflections by Diane Weider**

Thank you for allowing me to be the Lay Member to Annual Conference. This year it was truly a multicultural experience for me. Through Mary Balson, I met Pastor Shadrach and his wife Esther from the Congo and Pastor Haikki from South Korea. Through Pastor Ho Lee, I met Pastor Changki from South Korea along with his wife and children. There wasn't as much controversial business as there has been in the past few years. There was a vote to allow 43 churches to disaffiliate. This was a very sad piece of business. The vote passed so we now have 43 fewer United Methodist churches in Wisconsin. The Ingathering brought in 1,456 Personal Dignity kits and 246 Home Care kits, many sewing machines, medical equipment, bikes, school kits, shampoo, laundry detergent, blankets and more. It weighed in at 15,720 lbs. In 2 days a total of \$5,161.66 was donated. For me, the highlight was Pastor Ho Lee's ordination to full Elder status. Congratulations Pastor!!

#### **Sending Forth**

July is here and that means our annual drive for school supplies has arrived. Again this year, Covenant UMC will be participating in the county wide Back to School Program. We have been involved since the group started in 2012. Last year, they served 1579 students who needed assistance with obtaining school supplies. This year, they expect at least that many or more. Distribution will be on August 19th from 7:15 until 1:30. We will be collecting both supplies and monetary donations throughout the month of July. Supplies will be collected and delivered to The Boys and Girls Club the first week of August. Volunteer signup is online at Back to School Fond Du Lac. Also, registrations will take place online from July 10— August 7.

The supplies needed are 1" binders, calculators-T30X115, colored pencils, composition notebooks, Crayola washable markers, dry erase markers, glue/gluesticks, graph paper, highlighters, 3x5 index cards, No2 pencils, pencil bags, plain crayons, red pens, rulers, 7" scissors, Sharpie markers, sketch books, spiral notebooks—plain colors. Please note that the list has changed somewhat from other years.

#### **United Women in Faith**

Our June meeting included distributing our Banquet profits to The Boys and Girls Club, United Methodist Children Services in Milwaukee, a sewing machine to the Bolivia Project, funds to supply our Little Food Pantry, window/door project at church and funds to purchase books for our reading program.
