The Ways to Celebrate the Christmas Season

Advent and Christmas season is already here. Advent is the four-week season when all Christians, regardless of their denominations, expect, prepare, and celebrate the birth of Jesus and, at the same time, are looking forward to the second coming of Jesus on the final day. It is the joyful and exciting season that brings hope, faith, joy, peace, and light to the world, as the Advent wreath candles represent. Many people in the world celebrate this season beyond their culture, even religion. It is relatively easy to find many unbelievers worldwide enjoying this season by sharing their gifts and having a party. Other Meaningful Ways to Celebrate the Christmas Season

Other than worship service, there are various ways to celebrate the Christmas season meaningfully and spiritually. The first thing that comes into the mind is to have a personal devotional time. There are a lot of devotional books out there, and I strongly recommend using these resources in your devotional time. However, my strongest recommendation is the Bible, especially one of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, & John). How about reading the book of Luke during this Christmas season and reflecting on Jesus' life and ministry once again? For your personal use, the Bible reading chart is below.



Reading a good book about Christmas is one of the great ways to celebrate it. I strongly recommend "Faithful" (written by Adam Hamilton) this year. The book's author brings great and innovative insights into Christmas stories from Joseph's perspective. In addition, it is easy to read. Furthermore, this book is my primary material for the upcoming sermon series, "Joseph's Christmas." If you read it with my sermon, it will enrich your spiritual life. If you are not a reader, joining a Wednesday Bible Study group will be a good option. Based on videos, they will discuss Christmas stories from Joseph's perspective every Wednesday at 9:30 AM in the choir room.

Lastly, sharing your love with other neighbors through one of the church missions would be the best way to celebrate Christmas. The Little Food Pantry mission that Covenant UWF (United Women in Faith) began this year will be an excellent way to reach out to the marginalized in our neighborhood. The need for this mission is much more than we expected, so we stack this little pantry at the back of the church building three or four times a week. Giving away Christmas gifts to unknown low-income families through Angel Tree will bring you authentic Christmas joy. We are also collecting socks, mittens, and hats for the unfortunate children during this season. If you lose all those chances, you can still give away your monetary resources to our neighbor through the Christmas Eve offering. The church leaders decided to send all our Christmas Eve offerings to the Fond du Lac Holy Family Warming Shelter, which opens this year. These are programs and suggestions for your meaningful and spiritual Christmas season. I hope you will find a relationship with Jesus in a new way through these Christmas worships and missions.

Saturday, December 9. Meet at Church





Thank you for participating in the Ecumenical Thanksgiving Worship Service. From eight different congregations, around 100 people joined the worship service. Around \$600 were collected and given to New Fond du Lac Warming Shelter, 22 hygiene and cleaning supplies were sent to St. Katharine Drexel Shelter, and 51 non-perishable food items were brought to Fondy Food Pantry. Because this is the first attempt to have the Ecumenical Thanksgiving Worship service since the pandemic, this service is a small but important beginning for the unity of the church. Pastor Ho Lee encourages all church members to continue to support this ecumenical movement in this divisive world. FAMA (Fond du Lac Area Ministerial Association) plans another Ecumenical Worship Service to celebrate Martin Luther King Jr. Day.




