FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Looking Back 2 0 2 3

We are approaching the New Year 2024. Looking back to 2023, the Covenant UMC community experienced many unexpected events in that year. Especially since last October, when I came back from my medical leave due to nasal surgery, we have had many unexpected and somewhat depressing events.



First, our faithful church members left us and joined the eternal communion with God successively within this short period. It was the most surprising and disheartening event of all in 2023. Many church members, including me, felt loss and emptiness because all five of these were long-standing and faithful ones who had dedicated themselves to church worship, mission, and ministry. Moreover, we had heard about several church

members who suffered from grave illness. To make things worse, two staff members suddenly resigned for personal reasons. All these things happened in the last three months, from October to December, which was the church's busiest month of the year. To be honest, I was discouraged. I was worried about the church. I did not know how to comfort church members, simultaneously encouraging them to move forward with all these missions and ministries before us.

However, I realized that I was not the one who led the church. My concerns and worries about the church were unnecessary. This is because Covenant UMC is God's church. God leads and builds the church, not the pastor. Despite all these surprising and disheartening events, many church members did not lose their hearts. Instead, they stepped up for the missions and ministries of the church, considering them as a spiritual legacy the deceased church members left. Covenant UMC has done Soup Supper, Stewardship, Loaves and Fishes, Thanksgiving Ecumenical Worship Service, Combined Charge Conference, Angel Tree, Christmas Children's and Youth Program, and Cookie Walk in the last three months. We had not just done these missions. We completed these missions successfully, beating previous records in many cases. We also completed the big building project, replacing the two entrances in the educational building at this time. We even started a new mission, having the monthly community worship service in Lake House, an assisted living facility. Regarding church staff positions, SPRC (Staff-Parish Relation Committee) members worked hard so that we had more than 80 applicants for two positions. Now, they are in the process of interviewing them. They expect these new staffs to begin working from the beginning of 2024.

All these things were just a part of what we have completed in the last three months. How could the Covenant UMC, this small church, deal with these countless missions and ministries despite all adversities? I do not know how to explain, except for one: God works among us and through us. When we welcomed and celebrated six new church members in the middle of December, I once again experienced God's boundless love for Covenant UMC and His unexpected guidance. As an Angel told Mary and Joseph, God also tells us: "Do not be afraid. Emmanuel. I am with you."

Time to Connect

All our busy season passed. Personally and communally, we will have fewer events and gatherings than in the past three months. The cold weather will encourage us to stay home. In this silent and serene season, I suggest the following to our church members: *Connect!* This is the time to connect to God. We have fewer distractions this season. Let's try to be alone in our comfortable places and deeply connect to God through reading the Bible and prayer. What God really wants from us is not a lot of missions or accomplishments but a loving relationship with you through this alone time with God. This New Year, try to connect with God by being alone with Him.

Furthermore, this is a great time to connect with other church members. Our church members are not those we occasionally see and greet in the worship service. They are spiritual family members who walk the way of Jesus Christ together. They are essential relationships for our spiritual journey. Try to connect with them by praying, calling, sending cards, having a meal, or inviting them to your house. Try to build up authentic and meaningful relationships with each other. Among us, we have family members of the deceased church members. Please connect to them first and find a way to comfort them. This is one of the most challenging moments of their lives. Secondly, connect to new church members. Joining a new faith community is not easy. Show your hospitality! Lastly, connect to the church members whom you do not know much. Building a good relationship with church members was the key to the relationship with God.

New Sermon Series: "*Thinking Christian*"



Do you remember that we took a survey about sermon themes in 2022 winter? Many church members faithfully participated in this survey and carefully answered all its questions. I have used this survey result to plan sermon series since then. In this survey, there was a short-answer question at the end, asking '*what are your pressing spiritual and life questions?*' Much more than I expected, many church members shared their spiritual questions about their life and God. Among them, I will choose

five questions and talk about them based on the Bible as a new sermon series: 'Thinking Christian' in January and February. I do not think I know "the answer" to the church members' struggles and pressing spiritual questions. Also, these struggles and questions are complex and multifaceted, so it is hard to answer them simply. (If there was the one who claimed they knew the answer, this person would be too foolish or too arrogant.) However, at least I can wrestle with our church members over these life-pressing questions, consulting with the Bible, Christian History, books, and personal experiences. While discussing these questions openly, I believe we can see God's will for each of us more clearly and vividly. The schedule of the sermon with questions is the following:

Remember do not save prepaid postage type stamps as they are not accepted

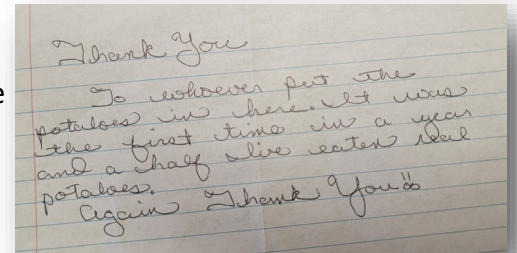

It warmed my heart on the following Sunday when that gentleman was there as I came at 8AM to fill pantry box again. He thanked me again! We are helping people in our community!

Welcoming New Residents

It's 1 pm on Sunday afternoon. I'm meeting in the church choir room with two young moms from Honduras. We're working on understanding the difference between "here" and "there". For fifty minutes we study simple English words, their spelling, meaning, and how to use them. The ladies leave with homework, which is what we'll start with next week. What a joy to see the accomplishments over the weeks, as the students go through the workbook and progress in their language comprehension.

I commit my time for class, as well as a bit of prep time each week. I've been doing this about four years and feel like I'm making a difference in someone else's life. When a person can read, write and speak in the primary language of the country they live in, they can access so much of the world around them. I feel as though I am living out the scripture from Leviticus 19:33-34:

'Don't mistreat any foreigners who live in your land. Instead, treat them as well as you treat citizens and love them as much as you love yourself. Remember, you were once foreigners in the land of Egypt. I am the Lord your God'

You too, can welcome those who are English language learners. As a tutor you receive training, the needed materials, and meet with 1 or 2 students. Class time is about one hour per week in a public location, such as the church or library. Talk to me, Denise Retzleff, or Pastor Janet Martinez to explore how to get involved.

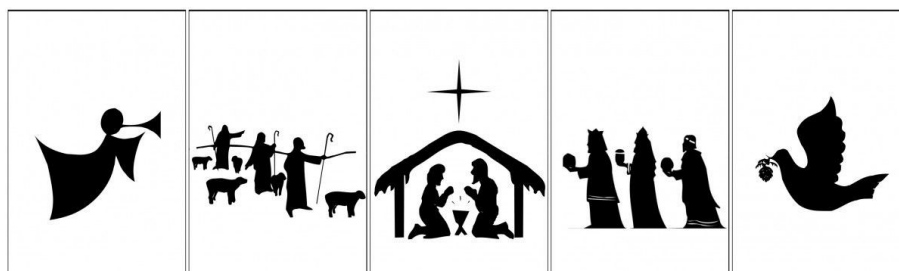
