From Pastor's Desk:

God's Amazing Grace in 2024:

I had a chance to look back on our church life in 2024 while preparing for the charge conference last month. One of the most prominent things I could not miss was how God has amazingly led our church to grow healthy and used us to do His missions. Since the last charge conference in December 2023, we have

lost around ten church members by death. Most were long-standing and faithful church members who played a critical role in leading community life. This loss saddened and discouraged us. I was also depressed and lost my confidence as a pastor around this time last year. However, God has been faithful and continued leading us throughout 2024. God blessed us with around fifteen new church members. Some church members stepped up and committed to various missions and ministries to cover the



loss of leadership. Sunday School and Youth Group has grown in number and spirit. Many church leaders have courageously added several new missions, and many church members have dedicated themselves to the existing and new missions, making almost all of them effective and successful. Yes, 2024 has been our faith community's recovery and growth year. I give thanks to God, sharing my joy and gratitude with all church members.

This recognition of God's grace in 2024 does not mean looking to heaven without doing anything. Instead, it leads the church leaders, staff, and me to plan the direction of the church more strategically for 2025 to make the church community a useful vessel through which God works. There is always some room to grow. We already recognized these areas and started discussing ways to make the church healthier, such as how to declutter missions and ministries to make them more effective and how to improve our discipleship and evangelism. Indeed, this is the time for the church to reflect on our past and plan for the future. However, these activities are not only for our communal lives but also our personal lives, especially our spiritual ones.

Plan for Our Spiritual Life

It requires intentional planning, extra attention, and persistent effort to excel in a certain area of life. Likewise, the relationship with God requires the same.

In this New Year, when people reflect on their past and plan for their future, how about paying attention to the most important thing in your life: your relationship with God? Please have a quiet time to think about your relationship with God in 2024 and plan how to deepen it more in 2025. For your spiritual planning, consider the following five areas of your spirit.

- Worship: Participate in worship service weekly, in person or online, unless you are sick or out of town (Members who travel out of town are encouraged to attend services in the location they are visiting.)
- 2) **Spiritual Practice**: Have personal devotional time with prayer and the Bible at least once a week, aiming at having it daily.
- 3) **Small Group**: Connect to at least one small group aimed at helping you grow in your faith.
- 4) **Mission**: Volunteer your time in Christian service at least once each year through the church's ministry.
- 5) **Giving**: Give financially in proportion to your income with the goal of tithing.

These five things are the membership expectations. However, they are not a requirement for membership. Rather, they are more about the official guidance for church members to deepen their relationship with God. Please use them for your healthier spiritual planning and journey.

January Sermon and Worship Services

The January sermon will be beneficial for your New year's spiritual resolution. This is because I will

pay attention to John the Baptist, who helped people prepare to receive Jesus as their King and Lord. In particular, his main message about repentance will invite us to examine ourselves to be freed from worldly desire and sins, and his austere life and passionate ministry encourage us to follow his exemplary way of holiness. In addition to that, we will have the Wesley's Covenant ritual on the first Sunday of the month. This traditional ritual leads us to repent our sins before God and renew our covenantal relationship with God.

On the second Sunday, when I join the Youth Winter Retreat, Rev. Mary Council-Austin will come and bring good news to us. On January 19th, the third Sunday of the month, we will have a ritual to install and introduce our church leaders for 2025. On the



last Sunday, we have the time to ponder on an international mission with the sermon by the pastor and the presentation by Jeff S. With the holy expectation, please come and join the January worship services.

I'm not completely sure what to expect from the confirmation program, to be completely honest; I would really like to become closer to and build a stronger relationship with God and the church as well.


Bible Study

2024 Annual Report Pacto de Gracia UMC

We are ending the year 2024, and we can say, "The Lord has not stopped helping us." It has been a year with enormous challenges and great blessings. The support of the United Methodist Churches of Fond du Lac County makes our work and mission possible.

Membership

After three and a half years of working with the Hispanic community, we have 21 members of different nationalities: Honduras, Nicaragua, Ecuador, the Dominican Republic, Colombia, Venezuela, El Salvador, Puerto Rico, and Mexico.

Lay Servant Ministries

Five members participated in the basic course in Spanish of the Lay Servant Ministries, held on October 12 and 19, 2024.

Community Closet

In January 2023, the Community Closet began helping our community with diverse needs. In two years, we have blessed more than three hundred families with beds, clothing, shoes, household goods, furniture, etc. The community closet has also helped people who have left prison, who are homeless, and who have been in shelters. When they found a place to live, we provided them with furniture, clothing, kitchen items, bedding, etc. The donations from the community closet make possible the Church's ministries and missions. These donations help people in need with rent, water, electricity, gas bills, medicine, immigration expenses, etc. All this work is possible thanks to the coordination of Dana Knack, volunteers, and the donations received.


