

From Pastor's Desk:

November Sermon and Worship

The sermon series **"What Is the Bible?"** will continue throughout November as we keep exploring the nature of Scripture and how to read it faithfully. In October, we reflected on two key aspects of the



Bible—its **human** and **divine** sides—and considered several guiding principles for reading Scripture: paying attention to its context, interpreting it through the greatest commandment to love God and neighbor, and discerning its meaning through the four authorities of **Scripture, tradition, reason, and experience**. In November, we will focus on the **Old Testament** and **New Testament** separately, learning how to approach each with greater understanding and appreciation. Below are the themes for the upcoming Sundays:

November 2 – All Saints Sunday

All Saints Sunday is a sacred day when we give thanks for all who have lived lives of faith and now rest in God's presence. It also reminds us of our own calling to grow in holiness and live as saints in the world today. During communion, we will light candles in memory of the saints of our church who have passed away since last All Saints Sunday, giving thanks for their faithful witness among us. The sermon will reflect on what the authentic Word of God is and how we encounter that Word in our reading of Scripture.

November 9 – Second Sunday

Many Christians tend to distance themselves from the Old Testament, viewing it as merely a Jewish historical record, a collection of difficult laws, or outdated teachings. On this Sunday, we will explore common misunderstandings about the Old Testament and discover a more balanced way to see and read it—examining, in particular, how Jesus himself engaged with these sacred writings.

November 16 – Third Sunday

This week's message will offer a broad overview of the Old Testament—an ambitious task for one sermon! While 20 minutes can only begin to touch the depth of its 39 books, it will provide a helpful framework for understanding its main themes and structure. My hope is that this overview will help you feel more connected to the world of the Old Testament and inspire you to begin reading one of its books yourself. After worship, we will gather to decorate the church for the Advent and Christmas season.

November 23 – Christ the King Sunday

The fourth Sunday of November is **Christ the King Sunday**, the final Sunday of the Christian year. Christ the King Sunday reminds us that our time and lives ultimately belong to Jesus Christ, the one true King. On this day, we celebrate his eternal reign and reaffirm our faith in his lordship over all creation. This Sunday will also conclude our sermon series, “**What Is the Bible?**”, with a 20-minute overview of the **New Testament**—highlighting the main themes of each book and guiding you on how to read them with deeper understanding and faith.

November 30 – First Sunday of Advent

The First Sunday of Advent begins a new year in the church calendar and ushers in the Christmas season. As we remember the birth of Jesus and his coming into the world, we are invited to begin anew with him. The church year beautifully guides us in this journey—beginning with the baby Jesus and ending with Christ the King. During Advent, we will focus on **Isaiah’s prophecies** about the coming Messiah and what they reveal about Jesus.

May these worship services and sermons help you **end this year with Jesus** and **begin the new one with renewed faith and hope in the Christ child**.

Small Group Ministry Update: Trillium Plans Visit to Milwaukee Museum

Dive into nature and culture with a visit to the Milwaukee Public Museum on **Saturday, November 1**, the next excursion planned by Trillium small group.

The museum is known for its outstanding exhibits and programs. These include a live butterfly enclosure, a Costa Rica rain forest replica, and dioramas depicting diverse natural and cultural settings. A popular exhibit called The Streets of Old Milwaukee will be decorated for Halloween. Another current exhibit called Bugs Alive includes live tarantulas and black widow spiders. Also, on November 1, the museum will host **the first annual 3 Rivers Powwow**, a kick-off to Native American Heritage Month. See the Grand Entrance at noon. 

Trustees




